The detection of Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD), Foot-and-Mouth Disease (FMD) and African Swine Fever (ASF) in our near neighbour, Indonesia, highlights the importance of having strong biosecurity systems in place. Livestock owners know their animals best. Key actions you can take now are:
