A message from the Mayor

The role of mayor in regional areas often means pulling together with our neighbours or with external partners to achieve the outcomes we all want for the Shire.

Recently, I've been talking with mayors from the Darling Downs South West Queensland (DDSWQ) Council of Mayors about some big issues that are important to us and that could impact on our communities.

Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) is high on our discussion list at the moment, and we're using a combined approach to apply pressure to the Federal Government to take real action on protecting our borders.

Taking a coordinated approach, the ten members of the DDSWQ Council of Mayors are speaking out alongside rural partners like AgForce and Regional Development Australia, to urge Federal Government Ministers to protect our borders and the beef and small livestock industry in Australia.

Central and western Queensland is the largest beef-producing region in Australia, with around one fifth of the country's total cattle production happening here.

The potential impact of FMD cannot be understated for not only the industry, but for the towns and communities that rely on its continued success.

Primary producers need to play their part too, making sure they have a strong biosecurity plan for their property.

We've included information on page 6 of this issue of the Bulletin that will help livestock owners understand the signs of FMD and lumpy skin disease (LSD) as well as resources for strengthening biosecurity management plans.

It was a real surprise to learn that our community has loaded



almost \$200,000 onto Buy Balonne Gift Gifts since the program began back in late 2019. What was even more surprising was that over \$45,000 worth of these cards haven't been redeemed.

Some of these cards are worth \$500 - that's a couple of visits to the grocery store, the fuel station or a shopping spree on its own. If you have some of the cards sitting in wallets or handbags, can I encourage you to check the balance and use it up.

Show some love to our local businesses, and let's see that \$45,000 getting out into our towns and communities. Coming off the business disruption caused by the May flood, this is a great way to give the local economy a bit of a boost.

Finally, I am overwhelmed by the support the Balonne region is showing to the inaugural Mayoral Ball. Tickets flew out the door at a rate we didn't expect and the event has now sold out.

I want to express my thanks to our generous sponsors for their support, and the community for getting on board so quickly for this charity event. Thank you.



Tourism Events Grants open this August

The next round of the Balonne Shire Council's popular Tourism Events Grant is opening 1 August.

Council offers a series of Tourism Events Grants to support event organisers in developing, promoting and executing events which contribute to growing tourism in the St George Region.

Tourism events are an important and growing part of our local economy and add to the vibrancy of our region. The Tourism Events Grants provide funding for events which have the potential to attract a significant number of visitors to the Balonne Shire.

Priority will be given to events which increase visitation to the Balonne Shire, generate positive media coverage, and stimulate the local economy.

The program provides a tiered range of grants to support event organisers to develop, promote and host events which make a positive and ongoing contribution to the Shire.

Funding is available across four



categories for pre-existing Shire events:

Regional Events (up to \$3,000)

Destination Events (up to \$4,000)

Major Events (up to \$7,000)

Hallmark Events (up to \$10,000)

In addition, one-off funding of up to \$3,000 is available for the development of new tourism events.

Applications open 1 February for events held between 1 July-30 December 2023.

6 Ways to Promote your Event for FREE!



List your event on the Balonne Community Diary. This is the go-to-place to list all local events both big and small. Simply Register your Organisation then follow the 5 Step Process to list your event for FREE.



Create a Facebook Event. Sharing your Event Poster to your Facebook page gets very little, if any, engagement. Rather create an Event attached to your page and invite all your friends. Then encourage them to invite their friends!



Design an Event Poster – use a free <u>template in Canva</u> if you're not good at design. Then post on local noticeboards & distribute to businesses & accommodation providers around the Shire (both digitally and physically).



Contact the Visitor Information Centre and notify staff of your event. They can promote to travellers through the Centre and through their social media channels.



Send an Event Notice to the <u>Balonne Bulletin</u> so it can be included in the local newsletter. While you're at it, send it to the local schools for promoting in their newsletters.



List your event on Australian Tourism Data Warehouse (ATDW). Want to attract visitors from beyond our Shire? List your event on ATDW. It will then be shared by Tourism & Events Queensland & Outback Queensland Tourism Association.

First time author returns with stellar debut

novel

While writing her debut novel, Clare Fletcher was surprised to rediscover a new love for her old hometown. Clare has spent much of the past 15 years in major international cities, including Sydney and New York, but will be returning to St George to speak about Five Bush Weddings at the St George Library on 5 August.

It is evident that writing this novel has renewed Clare's affection for St George and regional Queensland.

"I haven't been able to spend much time at home in recent years and it was a real pleasure to imagine myself there while I was writing," Clare said.

"Even though the towns in the book are fictionalised, there is a scene that takes place after the pub shuts and two characters buy pies from the back of the bakery late at night. I don't know if you can still do that in St George, but it was a very fond memory for me!"

Clare describes Five Bush Weddings as a light, fun story about a wedding photographer who is great at capturing other people's love stories but has not really had one of her own.



"It's about growing up and expectations and gossip and of course all different kinds of love. And if you're from country Queensland I hope some of the parties and wedding scenes might feel familiar."

Clare wanted to explore the period of life for women in their early thirties, when it feels like the world expects you to have achieved the impossible, including love, marriage, babies, owning a house and having an amazing career. As Clare got into the story, she discovered she was trying to say something more.

"I realised I was trying to say something bigger about why small towns and bush communities need young people to commit to them in order for these places to survive," said Clare.

"I came up with quite a grandiose justification for my silly love stories, but I do believe that people falling in love and starting families is important for regional Australia."

Livestock emergency animal disease preparedness

Emergency animal diseases have the potential to cause significant and far-reaching impacts to Australia's livestock industries, including considerable economic losses and restrictions. Lumpy skin disease (LSD) and foot-andmouth disease (FMD) are currently broaching the northern border of Queensland.

Now is the Time to ACT

The detection of LSD and FMD in our near neighbour, Indonesia, highlights the importance of having strong biosecurity systems in place.

Livestock owners know their animals best. Key actions you can take now are:

LOOK for and know the signs of animal disease

AgVet containers accepted for **DrumMUSTER on 5 August**

All landholders are invited to dispose of their empty AgVet chemical containers at Drum-MUSTER, Springwell Road, St George on Friday 5 August from 8 am to 12pm.

Proper rinsing and cleaning are the first steps in safely disposing of empty AgVet chemical containers. Clean containers are essential for meeting Occupational Health and Safety standards in our processes. Any rinsing should be done immediately after emptying the chemical container, as residues are much harder to remove when dry.

Cash bonanza in unused Buy Balonne Gift Cards

If you have an unused Buy Balonne Gift Card at home, you should definitely go and find it.

While almost \$200,000 in funds have been loaded onto these cards since the program began in October 2019, there is currently over \$45,000 yet to be redeemed on cards around the region.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole is encouraging residents to find their cards, check their balance and go shopping.

"The Buy Balonne Gift Cards are a great gift idea, but the real value is that the money spent on these cards is money that supports our region. 100% of the funds on the cards stay in the Balonne Shire. This is such an easy way to support local business.

"There are over 80 business participating in the program and many of those lost important tourism trade during the flood. Fuel, hardware, groceries, haircuts and accommodation are just a handful of items that can be purchased with the Buy Balonne Gift Cards."

Businesses are also encouraged to remind their customers that they accept the cards, through instore or online promotions. Any business that would like to participate or is experiencing any kind of problem with the cards can contact Garnet Radford, Council's Economic Development Officer.

One common issue for businesses is that ALL EFTPOS terminals of a business need to be activated from the business' activation card and if, for example, there is new ownership of a business, the new terminals need to be activated in order to accept the cards. The activation process takes less than 10



seconds per terminal.

Mayor O'Toole said "There are individual cards worth more than \$500 that are probably just sitting in drawers and wallets – someone is getting a nice surprise when they find they have a few hundred dollars to spend."
