



Iconic Thallon Silo Campsite to get Upgrades

Thallon's McGeever Recreational Campsite, at the base of the beautiful GrainCorp painted silos, are receiving a major overhaul in line with the Thallon Campground Masterplan to create a more user-friendly and attractive facility for residents and visitors.

The \$220,000 of upgrades will include a more functional and user-friendly layout, construction of picnic shelters, a Communal Camp Kitchen open to the community and visitors, as well as improved accessibility with a footpath connecting amenities and the kitchen.

Balonne Shire Mayor Samantha O'Toole said these upgrades give tourists a great opportunity to enjoy all the beauty that Thallon has to offer.

"There is no question that camping in the foreground of the beautifully painted Thallon GrainCorp silos is an unrivalled and wondrous experience," Mayor O'Toole said.

"The fact that we are increasing capacity and facilities is testament to the popularity of this unique location.

"I'm looking forward to seeing the grounds at capacity this camping season," she said.

The construction works will also see upgrades to the existing power mushroom heads and an additional twelve mushroom head powered campsites will be added to the campground.

A message from the Mayor

We are now well into 2023, with Easter already gone and noticeably cooler weather slowly edging its way into the early mornings in our Shire.

This year our Council has clearly hit the ground running and I'm delighted to see a range of major beautification and upgrade works getting started and underway right across our Shire.

Clearly, our main focus has been on delivering a broad range of road projects right across the Shire to continue addressing the damage caused by widespread flooding over recent years.

In St George, anyone who's passed through recently would've noticed that work has commenced on revitalising Victoria Street with the St George CBD Beautification Project. These works will aim to create a more urbanised environment, improve attractiveness and liveability for locals, attract tourists and will include construction of consistent footpaths and landscaping along the main street.

In Dirranbandi, we have similar beautification and construction works set to commence in the coming weeks at the River and Rail Precinct. This Precinct is already a popular spot with locals for family gatherings and other events, it is also an important tourist attraction for Dirranbandi. The upgrades to the Precinct include new walkways, providing a more inviting walking track through to the "Goods Shed", a historical railway building. It also includes new designated caravan and long-vehicle parking, with clear signage, making this area much more accessible and safer for tourists to park and explore the area.

In Bollon, construction works are set to commence to deliver a new, modern amenities block and new 2-metre-wide walkway leading from Walter Austin Park to the main camping area. This is a great addition to a highly sought after camping area in our Shire and will hopefully add to the serene camping experience in this location. Campers will also benefit from a new camping QR Code payment system to simplify the process, so that they can spend more of their time enjoying the surrounds of Wallam



Creek.

Council has also submitted an \$800,000 Grant Funding Application to fund the detailed design and construction of a Bollon Cemetery Flood Levee to better protect this historical and serene area during flooding periods.

We have a range of other projects in every township throughout our Shire, probably too many to mention here. I'm looking forward to getting out and seeing each and every one of them as they are completed.

In addition to all of the work inside our Shire, I've been spending a bit of time outside of the Shire as part of my role as Chair of the South West Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils (SWQROC). This position has seen me travel far and wide this month, I'm writing this message from Toowoomba where I'm currently meeting with our regional council counterparts to discuss opportunities to advocate for our region at the state level. We also had a packed two-day agenda in Canberra, meeting with Ministers, elected representatives and ministerial advisors. With the Federal Budget on the horizon, it was a great opportunity to put South West Queensland on the agenda and hear more from our national leaders.

Finally, I can't quite believe Easter has passed us by already...another year is rushing along at lightning speed! I hope everyone had an opportunity to enjoy some downtime over the Easter break and spend some time with family and friends, enjoying everything our region has to offer, particularly at this spectacularly beautiful time of year

Landscaping will be undertaken, including installing an irrigation system, green scaping and tree planting to beautify the area.

These works commenced onsite at the end of January and are expected to be finalised by June 2023.

As part of the upgrades, nightly camping rates for powered sites will increase from \$5.50 to \$10, unpowered sites will remain free.

These works are proudly funded by the Australian Government and Queensland's Fishing Infrastructure Grants Program.



Balonne's Youth set to Inspire & Lead

Year 10, 11 and 12 students from across the Balonne Shire attended the Inspire and Lead Youth Summit in St George last month. The event provided opportunities for students to be inspired, consider new and different career options and encourage them to become leaders of tomorrow.

The event was a collaborative venture, jointly organised by Country Universities Centre (CUC) Balonne, Balonne Shire Council and St George Aboriginal Housing. CUC Balonne Centre Manager, Alix Greenhill hopes that students walked away from the summit encouraged to chase their dreams.

"We hope students walked away knowing that they matter, their dreams matter and that they can be and do what they dream of," she said.

"I have been so impressed with the interest and engagement shown by students and hope they have benefited from gaining an insight into the many career pathways and support available to them.

Throughout the course of the day, students had the opportunity to hear from representatives from the University of Queensland about opportunities available at UQ, as well as the University of Southern Queensland who provided practical advice about careers now and into the future.

Students also heard from a group of young people, from a range of fields,

who spoke about their own experiences of pursuing their dreams and achieving career success in the Balonne Shire.

The highlight for many of the students was an uplifting address from the keynote speaker, J-MILLA, a 24-year-old member of the Mak Mak Marranungu people. He told his story about the power of narra-

tive in his culture and how music and storytelling has been a powerful and positive influence on him and those around him, he also gave a live performance.



The 2023 Inspire and Lead Youth Summit has been the second youth summit held in the Balonne Shire and organisers are hoping it is a summit that will continue to grow and expand for years to come.







Southwest Queensland Mayors Take Critical Issues to Canberra

With the federal budget on the horizon, regional leaders from the Southwest Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils (SWQROC) congregated in Canberra last month, spending two packed days meeting with elected representatives and ministerial advisors.

SWQROC Chair, Samantha O'Toole, said the trip was a fantastic opportunity to ensure Southwest Queensland remains high on the agenda with national leaders and to unlock the potential of the region.

"Our meetings with both elected representatives and ministerial advisors were invaluable opportunities not only to ensure critical issues in our region are being addressed, but also to promote and grow the potential of our region," Mrs O'Toole said.

The Government's commitment to implementing the Murray Darling Basin Plan and water buybacks was a critical issue in discussions with the Hon Minister Tanya Plibersek (Minister for Environment and Water) and Queensland senators including the Hon Senator James McGrath, the Hon Senator Gerard Rennick and the Hon Senator Susan McDonald. The SWQROC group advocated for the need to ensure communities are well engaged and compensated for the economic and social impacts of buybacks.

The delegation also had detailed discussions about key education opportunities and challenges in the region, including support for Country University Centres, early childhood care and education challenges, when meeting with the Hon Senator Anthony Chisholm (Assistant Minister for Regional Development

and Assistant Minister Education), the Hon Anne Aly MP (Minister for Early Childhood Education and Minister for Youth) and Fiona Nash (Regional Education Commissioner).

While meeting with the Hon Kristv McBain MP (Minister for Regional velopment, Local Government and Territories), Brendan Moon AM (CEO, National Emergency Management

Agency) and Nathan Dal Bon (CEO, National Housing Finance and Investment Corporation), the group were able to discuss options to address the housing crisis in Western Queensland and escalating household insurance premiums, protecting critical funding programs, including investment in rural road networks and disaster funding arrangements.

Other agenda items included carbon farming in Southwest Queensland and net zero transition, which were discussed with the Hon Senator Larissa Waters, the Hon Senator Penny Allman-Payne and

South West the Hon Senator Anthony Chisholm. While a meeting with the Hon David Littleproud MP provided a chance to discuss ideas to promote and grow the potential of communities in Southwest Queensland.

SWQROC represents, advocates and creates opportunities for the six local governments of the Southwest Queensland region, including Balonne Shire Council, Bulloo Shire Council, Maranoa Regional Council, Murweh Shire Council, Paroo Shire Council and Quilpie Shire Council. information, www.swqroc.com.au.



Bollon Infrastructure Upgrades


The town of Bollon is set to receive around \$400,000 in upgraded, modern facilities with a new amenities block and walkway in the central Walter Austin Park.

The new, upgraded amenities block will feature modern showers and toilet facilities that will be complimented by new access via a new 2-metre-wide walkway along the beautiful Wallam Creek.

Construction works are set to commence in mid-late April with this new upgraded facility due for completion by the end of May 2023 and are joint funded by the Balonne Shire Council and the Australian Government.

Campers in Bollon will also benefit from a new and simpler payment facility for camping in Bollon with new Camping QR codes, so that campers to this popular destination can more simply and easily pay their fees and sit back and enjoy the serene location.

In addition this, Council to has submitted an \$800,000 Grant Funding Application to fund the detailed design and construction of a Bollon Cemetery Flood Levee to better protect this historical and serene area during flooding periods.



Wild Dog Baiting Program Commences in May

Balonne Shire Council will be conducting a coordinated Wild Dog Baiting Program in May, using baits injected with 1080, which is a management tool targeted to control wild dogs.

Failure to control wild dogs and feral pigs can result in livestock and crop losses, attacks on domestic pets and loss of native fauna.

Landholders have a legislative responsibility to control declared pests on their land and participation in this program is an effective way to help meet this responsibility.

Baiting stations will be held throughout Balonne Shire from Thursday 11 May to Friday 19 May 2023.

All participants must register their intention to conduct baiting – this will allow sufficient time to receive baiting information and ensure all administrative requirements are met prior to attending the baiting station.

Participants must present their rates notice and a sealable container to collect baits.

Protection of domestic and working dogs: Owners of domestic and working dogs are advised to restrain or muzzle their dogs during the baiting program to minimise the risks of dogs wandering and coming into contact with poison baits.
