



Mayoral Ball Proceeds Boost Education In Balonne

The 2023 Mayoral Ball has delivered a major boost to education in the Balonne with a donation of \$50,635 to the Balonne Country Universities Centre to support local students.

The donation was handed over to the Balonne CUC at their 2023 End-of year Graduation Ceremony and will cover student bursaries to support student's travel and the cost of other resources associated with their studies.

Since the Centre began in May 2021, the Balonne Country Universities Centre has welcomed 232 students, which far exceeds the original target of 38 students over the first four years.

Balonne Shire Mayor, Samantha O'Toole was delighted to have the Mayoral Ball create such a great result for education in the Shire.

"I'm absolutely delighted that the Mayoral Ball was able to raise and contribute over \$50,000 towards helping our youth follow their education goals whilst staying in the Shire, close to their families and loved ones," said Mayor O'Toole.

"The Balonne Country Universities Centre has become an absolute game-changing initiative for our Shire and it is an honour to be able to further support their efforts.

"The Mayoral Ball was a wonderful night, with 135 people attending the event and involved some big-hearted bidding throughout the auction, fundraising activities and generous contributions from our corporate sponsors.

"All combined, the evening raised a substantial sum of money to support local students to achieve their educational goals, without them having to leave their hometown.

"I would like to extend a massive thank you to everyone who attended, contributed and donated at the Mayoral Ball, as your

A message from the Mayor

As this will be my last message from the Mayor prior to entering the caretaker period before the Local Government Elections, it is a wonderful time to reflect on some of the highlights of the term.

The 2020 Local Government Elections occurred while we were experiencing our first lock down of the Covid-19 pandemic, which required Councillors to be sworn in under social distancing protocols and we quickly got used to a combination of working both in person and in a virtual world. The Shire was challenged early with the Queensland/ NSW border closures and strong advocacy was required for us to get a workable 'Border Bubble' in place.

The 2020 Elections were also held during the first rains that began to see our horrific drought break and we had a major flood in the Balonne Shire. To many, this flood was welcomed, as it returned water into Beardmore Dam, Jack Taylor Weir and to our towns, farms and businesses. My tenure as Mayor has seen numerous floods down each of the river systems in Balonne and we have had 9 disaster declarations. I would like to thank those Council staff, Contractors, Emergency Services and all involved in our Local Disaster Management Group for the excellent working relationship we have to collaborate to protect our communities.

As a Council, we have focused on getting on with the jobs that were required to see our community recover from disasters and grow into the future. Roads are a constant focus for us and that has encompassed repair and restoration of local roads following many rain and flooding events, applying for grants and implementing betterment projects to future proof roads and to advocate and work with the Department of Transport and Main Roads to see our highways improved and provide better flood resilience for our communities.

Council has focused on building strong relationships with Progress Associations throughout the Shire, which has seen attendance at these meetings consistently



throughout the term. This has allowed improved communication and collaboration on projects to advance each of the smaller towns. We were proud to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with Moree Plains Shire Council to establish an enduring partnership to collaborate for the best outcomes for Mungindi 2406.

Council has focused on curbing our population decline and actively sought funding for exclusion fencing to facilitate more small stock and our Country University Centre Balonne to allow locals access to higher education support.

Council has focused on core community infrastructure to improve the liveability of our communities and built and improved facilities such as public toilets, splash parks, playgrounds, showgrounds, libraries, free camping facilities, and skateparks.

As we close out the Term, I would also like to publicly thank the Councillors that served with me this term including Bill Winks, Robyn Furhmeister, Scott Scriven, Rod Avery, Alex Benn and Adam Osborne, as well as past Councillors Ian Todd and Richard Lomman. Your time and dedication through service to our communities should be remembered and it has been an honour to work with you this term.

Dirranbandi Water Treatment Plant upgrades finalised

On 21 September 2023, Council announced plans for a \$100,000 infrastructure upgrade at the Dirranbandi Water Treatment Plant after a comprehensive investigation into the operation and capability of the system to continue meeting Dirranbandi's unique blended bore/river water supply.

Council has now finalised these works to the Water Treatment Plant, which are aimed

at ensuring Dirranbandi's water supply continues to remain in line with Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.

Council has also undertaken an extensive range of training and professional development initiatives for the team that oversees the water supply process for Dirranbandi, which will be ongoing into the future.

Microgrid Energy Assessment for Balonne Shire

In January 2021, Council partnered with All Energy Pty Ltd to apply for the Regional and Remote Communities Reliability Fund to undertake a feasibility study into alternate energy microgrids for the Balonne Shire area.

Council was advised in March 2022 that the funding application was successful and has been working with All Energy to complete a feasibility report into a range of microgrid power supply options throughout the Shire.

A microgrid is a small-scale electricity network that connects power consumers to an electricity supply, which can improve the security, reliability and efficiency of electricity supply, especially in remote areas and for disaster supply, or places with interruptions such as blackouts.

All Energy has now completed their assessments, which involved feasibility studies into more reliable, secure and cost-effective energy supply to remote communities looking at microgrid technologies to replace, upgrade or supplement existing electricity supply arrangements in off-grid and fringe-of grid communities.

The assessments included potential microgrids within St George's Airport Industrial Hub, Council facilities at St George, Dirranbandi, Thallon, Hebel, Bollon, Mungindi and Nindigully with a primary focus on community resilience to ensure water, food and telecommunications availability at emergency response centres during natural disasters.

The assessment also included a number of Case Studies covering the prospect of microgrids for agricultural, horticultural and other businesses in the Shire.

Some Case Study examples include biomass waste to energy from farming production, producing ammonia for fertiliser from renewable energy to hydrogen and using solar energy for irrigation water pumping.


Balonne Shire Remembers

With the help of funding from the Department of Veterans Affairs, Balonne Shire Council has engaged a qualified Historian to collate the records of veterans and former servicemen who have a connection with the Balonne Shire.

This project involves a detailed collation of information from a range of databases to record the details of veterans who lived in the Shire at the time of enlisting or serving, or those who were born in or originated from the Shire prior to enlisting.

To date, the project has uncovered close to 500 veterans who have a connection with the Shire and is in the process of confirming the details and records.

Another key aspect of the project is identifying veterans who were born outside the Shire and enlisted outside of the Shire, but have a link to the Shire. We are also seeking those veterans with service from Vietnam to the current era of service.



The records of these two groups of veterans are either not available or are more difficult to identify and these will require help from the local community. Consequently, the project team will rely on information from the local community to assist in identifying these veterans.

Over the coming months, the project will undertake community information sessions that will provide the local community an opportunity to meet the team and provide information about any veteran who might be part of these difficult group to identify.

Once complete, these records will be stored on three digital touch-screen monitor stands based in the St George Library, St George Visitor Information Centre and the Dirranbandi Rural Transaction Centre (RTC).

ENVIRO-COLUMN Mimosa Bush

Mimosa bush can spread readily and grow quickly. As it often forms thorny thickets, it can be a considerable nuisance during mustering and can also hinder stock access to water. Mimosa does offer shade in open downs country and can be useful as a supplement to grass during the dry season.

It may therefore be a useful plant in some areas if its spread can be controlled to prevent thicket formation. The maintenance of healthy pasture competition is the best mechanism to achieve this.

To manage, Basal Bark Spray is effective.



Government collaboration ramping up for Mungindi

Last week, representatives from Balonne Shire Council, Moree Plains Shire Council and the New South Wales government came together to officially open the new Mungindi \$300,000 boat ramp with a ceremonial launch of the local State Emergency Service vessel taking centre stage.

The boat ramp is another great example of government collaboration with the construction being undertaken by Balonne Shire Council on Queensland soil and funding coming from the New South Wales Department of Primary Industries' Recreational Fishing and Camping Facilities Program through an application by the Moree Plains Shire Council.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole praised Moree



Plains Shire Council for their funding grant and the New South Wales government for the funding that made this new boat ramp possible.

"Getting funding and building projects is hard enough at the best of times, but in a cross-border town like Mungindi it can often take a combined effort of collaboration from multiple parties to bring projects like this together", Mayor O'Toole said.

"To have the New South Wales government fund the construction of a boat ramp on Queensland soil is testament to the kind of collaboration that we deliver in Mungindi.

"It is also a great example of common sense, as building the boat ramp on this side of the river creates a great connection to all of the new infrastructure that was recently put into the Mungindi River Park.

"This boat ramp and the recent upgrades to the Mungindi River Park will also greatly benefit the local Mungindi community on both sides of the border in terms of liveability and improved amenities and accessibility to attract more tourism to the area.



"The installation of this boat ramp is now the final piece in the upgrade of the Mungindi River Park, following a complete \$750,000 overhaul of the park facilities that were finalised in 2022."
