

Balonne Shire Flourishes with Business and Tourism Boost

The Balonne Shire has received a notable transformation in recent times, following the successful completion of the Balonne Business Improvement Program in April 2024.

With a strategic investment of over \$1.26 million and under the guidance of Council, the initiative has revitalised businesses in our commercial districts across the Shire, bolstering local businesses and enhancing tourism prospects.

The program has provided benefits via two streams to maximise impact:

- **Visual Improvement:** Focused on aesthetic external and internal enhancements, including painting, new panels, fencing, verandas, flooring, landscaping, and more.
- **Energy Efficiency:** Aimed at reducing energy cost and carbon footprints through solar installations, battery storage, and energy-efficient lighting and refrigeration.

This program's reach was extensive, with 71 applications received, leading to the approval of 53 projects being delivered across all seven townships.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole welcomed how the outcomes of this project have improved the visual amenity and energy efficiency for local businesses. "Because of this project, our Shire is now much better placed to welcome tourists and investors alike, showcasing its commitment to progress and resilience."

"The Balonne Business Improvement Scheme has been a great example of a well-delivered government and business collaboration," said Mayor O'Toole.

"This program has not only improved the visual and energy profiles of businesses, but also contributed to economic sustainability and job retention.

"This program also sends a clear message to anyone thinking of setting up a business here that Balonne Shire is not just open for business, it's a shining example of what can be achieved with a business friendly Council.

"Local contractors were also a focal point in delivering this program, receiving 49% of the total spend, amounting to over \$610,000 in business."

This program was made possible from funding of \$833,000 from the Australian Government under the Murray-Darling Economic Development Program and \$427,000 in co-contributions from proponents.

Stormwater Upgrades & Planning across the Shire

Council is currently undertaking a range of actions and assessments of stormwater drainage in townships across the Shire and is seeking community feedback to assist in identifying the most impacted areas.

In some areas, ageing or deteriorated drainage infrastructure and sub-standard drainage solutions that were installed decades ago, are causing issues with the stormwater drainage networks and need to be upgraded to better deal with rainfall events.

Recently, Council received funding from Local Government Grants & Subsidies Program to undertake master drainage studies for St George and Mungindi to identify key local drainage issues that may be impacting residents and prepare detailed engineering solutions to alleviate drainage issues.

In Dirranbandi, Council is also currently awaiting a response from the Queensland Resilience & Risk Reduction Fund for a



grant application to undertake a broader assessment of stormwater drainage in Dirranbandi with a comprehensive master drainage study.

In the interim, Council is currently coordinating the design and engineering of three short-term solutions to assist in mitigating potential inundations from major rainfall events in Dirranbandi.

Council will also be inviting tenders in the coming weeks to construct a new pump station with new inlet and outlet mains to pump stormwater at the detention basin near Crothers St, Dirranbandi to the river.

This new pump station in Dirranbandi will help convey stormwater and subsequently diminish ponding for the southern area of town.

As further funding opportunities become available, Council plans to submit similar applications for master drainage studies for the townships of Thallon, Hebel and Bollon.

Residents in our townships are urged to provide feedback on any stormwater drainage issues that may be impacting their properties during rainfall events to the Balonne Stormwater Drainage Survey that can be accessed on the Council website or by scanning the QR code above.

Ag Immersion Program Empowers Students in Balonne

Recently, 17 students from St George State High School and Toogoolawah State High School attended the Ag Immersion Program, which is a collaborative effort involving St George State High School, and Balonne Shire Council.

The Ag Immersion Program, developed through the Balonne Agriculture, Water, and Environment (AWE) Collaboration, is empowering students to explore the world of agriculture, water, and environmental management.

The aim of this program is to provide an immersive learning experience for students in Years 10–12 from across the State, equipping them with practical skills, industry knowledge, and valuable networks for future employment in the field of agriculture. This is the third camp for this program so far and over this five-day camp students learned first-hand insights into cotton production, onion and garlic production and processing, wool production, farm machinery, irrigation systems and agricultural aviation career pathways.

By connecting classroom learning with real-world applications, Caitlin Crowe and Greg Fisher (from the St George State High School) are nurturing the next generation of agricultural leaders with four students from each camp having indicated a desire to return to the area to explore job opportunities.

St George Aerodrome Hangar Allotment Development

Council has completed bitumen works at the St George Aerodrome to the apron and taxiway, including a culvert underneath the existing taxiway and electrical and data to service the future hangars.

These initial works will pave the way for a larger industrial development of the aerodrome into the future, which will include roads for serviced allotments suitable for industrial purposes.

These development works were managed by Balonne Shire Council and funded by the Queensland Government under the Building our Regions funding program.

Landholders urged to prepare now as bushfire season looms

A mixture of high vegetation loads and persistent frosts across south west Queensland have led to an increased risk of bushfires this season.

The Rural Fire Service Queensland (RFSQ) is urging property owners to get on top of their bushfire preparation now, with dry grass posing a significant fire risk.

RFSQ South Western Region Manager Bushfire Mitigation, Inspector Michael Welsh, said it's important residents act now during the cooler months to ensure their bushfire preparation is on track.

"If you're a landholder, now is the time to think about your responsibilities ahead of the fire season," he said.

"Ensure there is adequate access in and around your property for crews to enter, giving them the best chance to stop the progress of a fire.

"Simple steps like mowing your lawn regularly, trimming overhanging branches and getting rid of flammable materials from around your home can all help to reduce your risk."

Region to Receive Funding to Help Combat Feral Pigs

Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries has announced \$2 million in funding to help combat the State's feral pig problem with Desert Channels Queensland and the South West Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils (SWQROC) set to receive the funding.

As a member of SWQROC, Balonne Shire Council is set to benefit from this funding, which will see the employment of four feral pig management coordinators across the two regions awarded by the State government.

These coordinators will support the initiation and delivery of effective feral pig management, bolstering local biosecurity efforts in line with the Department's Queensland Feral Pest Initiative.

Whyenbah Road Sealing Upgrades

Council has recently finished an additional 19.7 kilometres of bitumen seal along Whyenbah Road, north of the Bridge.

This additional bitumen sealing now brings the total sealing along Whyenbah Road from Balonne Highway heading south to a total of around 40 kilometres.

These works were made possible from funding that Council secured through the Queensland Reconstruction Authority, the Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme and Roads to Recovery Program.

Council also has around \$1.1 million of works scheduled in the 2024/25 financial year for upgrades to Jakelwar-Goodooga Road.

Community Working Group taking action to keep GP Services in St George

Following a Community Stakeholder Forum, a number of Community dropin sessions and a Community Survey, a Community Working Group has been meeting to drive the establishment of a community-based model that will be able to continue General Practice services in St George.

The Community Working Group is currently investigating the different potential organisational structures that may be put in place to manage the GP services in St George into the future.

At the meeting on 26 June 2024, the Working Group appointed a Chair John Travers and Deputy Chair Ben Brimblecombe to coordinate the group until the potential establishment of a Board.

The Working Group has created a Finance sub-group, which is investigating the various costs and grant funding opportunities open to the different business structures.

As part of the Working Group's investigations, they have also met with representatives of other GP clinics that have successfully transitioned to a community-based model. The next steps in this process for the Working Group include developing a business plan, setting up an entity and raising the funds necessary to bring this venture to fruition.

The initial Community Survey has now closed, but there may be further Community Survey's in relation to this topic as it progresses into the future.




