Mayoral Ball donations advancing education in Balonne

We are pleased to announce that the 2024 Mayoral Ball raised a record \$65,515.85, which was donated to the Country Universities Centre Balonne Bursary Fund at the recent graduation ceremony.

This takes the grand total of contributions from the past three Mayoral Balls to over \$161,000.00 towards helping students at CUC Balonne with study resources and travel while they focus on achieving their tertiary educational goals.

To date, the CUC Balonne has received 336 registrations, which is well over the original target of 38 and over \$80,000 has been distributed to students through the Bursary Fund.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole was delighted to hand over the \$65,515.85 proceeds to the CUC Balonne Bursary Fund and present certificates to the 18 newest CUC Balonne graduates.

"The Country Universities Centre Balonne has been such a successful and welcomed addition to our Shire", said Mayor O'Toole.

"From our original target of 38 students over four years, we never in our wildest dreams imagined the successful uptake of over 336 students registering in three years.

"The Balonne Shire Mayoral Ball was originally started as a fundraising event to support students with funding for their

resources and travel needs and the three to date have become just as successful as the CUC itself.

"I am so proud of the fundraising success we've achieved from the Mayoral Ball's to support CUC students wanting to stay in the Shire with family and friends while they achieve their educational goals.

"Thank you to everyone who contributed to each of our Mayoral Ball's, as the \$161,000 we've raised is an exceptional effort and goes a long way towards supporting our students in Balonne.

"Most of the bursary funding has supported students studying nursing, education and agriculture, which is exactly the kind of educational backgrounds we are wanting to attract to our region.

"I am very much looking forward to next year's Mayoral Ball and hope to exceed this year's record amount."

A message from the Mayor



From fires and township evacuations, to flooding throughout the Shire, it's been quite a month in terms of disaster management.

In so many ways, the Balonne Local Disaster Management Group (LDMG) is accustomed to dealing with flooding and the much slower nature it is currently unfolding throughout our riverine landscape at the moment, which is in stark contrast to the rapid way in which the recent Dirranbandi fire situation unfolded.

The actual disaster management of the fire situation was headed up by the lead agency, the Queensland Fire Department, as one would expect. However, in terms of the evacuation, the succinct, swift and comprehensive response would not have been possible without all members of the LDMG, and indeed the community, stepping up quickly and decisively.

Since the fire occurred, the LDMG has undertaken a lot of work to assist with recovery in Dirranbandi, as well as to

dissect the events of the night and ensuing days to uncover a number of lessons learnt, including a community debrief in Dirranbandi and an internal LDMG debrief.

One of the key take-outs from these actions was that there appears to be a lack of understanding around the Australian Warning Systems. I understand we have so many different government systems and acronyms we are expected to be across in our day-to-day lives, but understanding the Australian Warning System is quite literally a life and death matter.

I would urge everyone to familiarise yourself with the three key elements of the Australian Warning System, which are 'Advice', 'Watch and Act', and 'Emergency Warning' by going to www.australianwarningsystem.com.au. Understanding these directions will ensure we can all be as prepared as possible in the event that disaster comes our way again.

On another note, 2024 really has been a year full of major changes within Council. From the election of a new Council to the transition to our incoming CEO, Michelle Clarke. I do hope these changes have occurred with as little impact as possible to residents and to the day-to-day operations of Council.

I am very much looking forward to a year of more stability in 2025 and I have every faith that our new CEO Michelle Clarke, with her extensive experience in Local Government and intimate knowledge of our Council and Shire will help to deliver that for us.

As this is the last Bulletin for the year, I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a safe, happy and prosperous New Year. I hope you all get to spend plenty of time with family and friends over this festive season and I look forward to seeing you all again in 2025.

Annual Report highlights infrastructure boost to the Shire



Council's 2023/24 Annual Report has now been adopted by Council and it highlights a record spend of over \$97 million on infrastructure, essential services and community initiatives for the residents of Balonne Shire.

Roads and infrastructure services accounted for the lion's share of funding at a cost of around \$76 million, including \$53 million spent on flood recovery works.

A total of \$13 million in capital funding assisted in upgrading our road network with betterment projects after multiple flood events over recent years.

Council's financial statements were audited and certified by the Queensland Audit Office.

More broadly, the report shows our region produced around \$493million in Gross Regional Product, which places the region 8th in Queensland in terms of agricultural production and output.

Mayor Samantha O'Toole was pleased to present the annual report, which outlines a record year of investment into infrastructure and community initiative throughout the Shire.

"This year was a huge effort by the entire Council team to deliver a record budget of over \$97 million in infrastructure and upgrades for the residents of the Shire", said Mayor O'Toole.

"Delivering this level of infrastructure and community initiatives is even more remarkable given Council's limited annual rates income is around \$11 million.

"This kind of investment was only made possible through grant funding secured by Council.

"As a Council, we invested a lot of time and energy into focussing efforts on improving the liveability of our Shire with the appropriate infrastructure.

"The year ranged from beautification works in the heart of Dirranbandi and St George, to our ongoing cross-border collaboration to support the needs of Mungindi residents with a new boat ramp and delivery of the water security project.

"We want our Shire to be more than just a great place to visit, we want it to be renowned as a great place to live and set up business, which was further supported with the delivery of our business improvement and mentoring programs.

"I commend this past year's Annual Report to residents of Balonne, to inform you of the initiatives Council is delivering to make our Shire a better place for all."

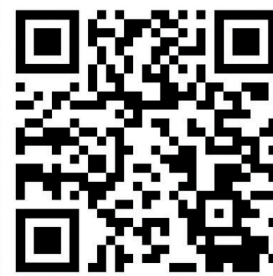

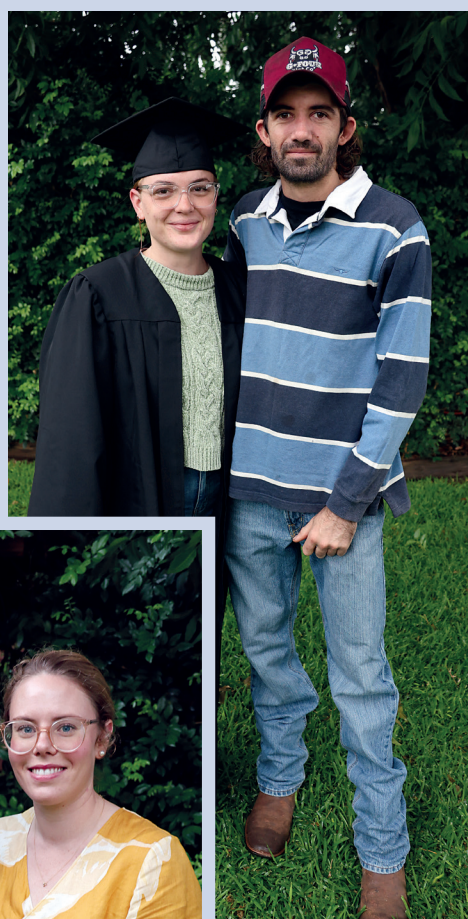
