

2024 was a great year for CUC Balonne, finishing the year with an inspirational graduation ceremony and a fabulous Campus Immersion Trip. 2025 is shaping up to be equally exciting.

Last year saw 18 local students completing their studies with 11 students able to participate in a special graduation celebration held at Riversands. We look forward to continuing to support local and visiting students.

We offer a quiet dedicated study space with reliable internet along with wrap around support for anyone studying certificate level courses or University courses and for those wanting to explore study options. All services are offered free of charge and we offer travel and resource bursaries to local students.

Since opening in 2021 we have supported over 350 students, with many graduates now working locally. As well as enriching our community and supporting individuals, one of our goals is to build a skilled locally grown workforce.

In the first week of December, we took 18 high school students from Year 7 – 9 to eight university campuses in Toowoomba, Ipswich and Brisbane. Students were from St George State High School and Dirranbandi State School. They had a fabulous time which opened their eyes to new possibilities for their futures. In the words of one student: "It was the best experience of my life." Congratulations goes to Eliza Woodruffe our Student Engagement and Success Coordinator who meticulously organised this week long adventure. Thanks also goes to Macarlya Waters, Michael Bermingham, Kylie Hegarty, Belle Sing and our university partners who supported this project.

We have much to look forward to in the coming year. Plans are being made for the annual Cultural Blessing Ceremony, to rejuvenate and refresh our mind, body and soul for the new educational year. The 2025 Youth Summit is also well underway. This year's event, to be held on April 2, is themed to align with 2025 being the International Year of Quantum Science and Technology, and we're excited to present Exploring Horizons: To Infinity In 2024, CUC Balonne was able to deliver extensive widening participation activities for the youth of our Shire through the Horizons program. These activities nurture the aspirations of our young people, broaden horizons and help with making dreams a reality. Sporting Horizons and the Campus Immersion Trip were examples of these highly successful events. ENVIRO-COLUMN HUDSON PEAR



Hudson pear is a densely branched cactus that can grow up to 1.5 meters high and 3 meters wide. Its green to grey-green stem segments are cylindrical, up to 90 cm long, and 4 cm wide. These segments are easily detached and can be whorled or sub-whorled.

The reverse-barbed spines of Hudson pear pose a significant threat, capable of injuring livestock, humans, and native animals. This reduces or even prevents grazing activities, impacting productivity.

Classified as a category 2, 3, 4, and 5 restricted invasive plant under the Biosecurity Act 2014, Hudson pear must not be given away, sold, or released into the environment.

The plant spreads through small stem segments that dislodge from the parent plant when brushed against by animals, people, vehicles, or machinery. These segments take root upon contact with the ground, facilitating its spread





Fingerling Release Creating a Healthier River System



Dirranbandi Master Plan set to shape the town's future

Council trialling a shift to fortnightly meetings

Council is looking to change its regular monthly ordinary meeting schedule and is undertaking a 3-month trial of fortnightly ordinary Council meetings.

The aim of this initiative is to deal with the workload of Council requirements more effectively.

On 15th February, 6 participants from Dirranbandi, Bollon, Goondiwindi and Roma begin their mandatory operational firefighter training for the role of Auxiliary Firefighter with Queensland Fire and Rescue Service.

The training course runs over 5 weekends and covers training in safe working practices, operating breathing apparatus, fundamentals of urban firefighting, as well as operating response and communications systems and equipment.

Auxiliary Firefighters are paid casual, station-based firefighters who respond to emergency situations when the demand arises and are an integral part of the frontline emergency and disaster response in Queensland.

Whether they are called to help handle a bushfire emergency, or to pick up the pieces after a major flooding event – the role is crucial to protecting Queensland's people, property and environment from harm and provides an opportunity to give back to their community and earn a respected place amongst their peers.
